### Statement on dealing with Conflict Minerals


Dewit Industrial Sensors BV (DIS Sensors) strongly supports the efforts to eliminate the trade in conflict minerals. We refer to Section 1502 of the Dodd Frank Act. This attempts to ensure that the tin, tungsten, tantalum or gold or not being sourced originate from mines in the Democratic Republic of the Congo (DRC) or adjoining countries.

We as a non-publicly traded company are not directly subject to this law. Despite that, this is very critical because extracting and trading minerals finances armed groups and military forces who commit serious violations of human rights. This circle of suffering and violence must be stopped.

We require our suppliers to observe this requirement at all times and to be able to trace their supply chain back to the mines where their minerals originate. We do provide this information to the Responsible Business Alliance (RBA), formerly known as the (EICC) and the Global e-Sustainability Initiative (GeSI), through the Responsible Minerals Initiative (RMI) as a member of iPoint (16767).
